- If someone is rude to you, don't be rude back.

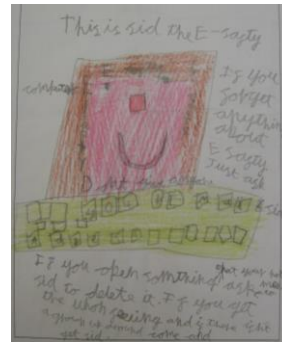

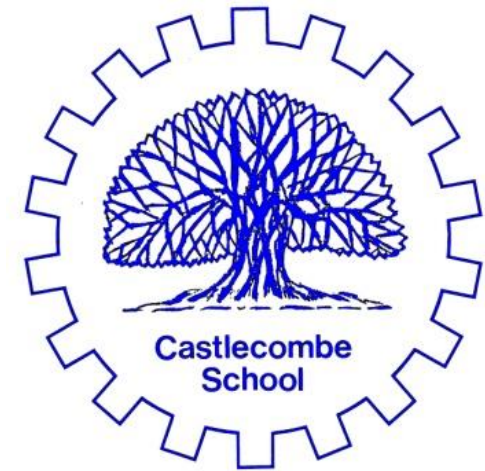
Key Stage 1 Winner:
